## Abstract

Human biology is cultural biology and social and cultural processes play a central role in psychiatric disorders both at the level of basic biobehavioral mechanisms and through narrative practices. We are narrative beings, fashioning our selves from the stuff of stories, locating our biographies and life projects in discursive webs of shared meaning. Understanding the human capacity to produce, think in, and transact through narrative must play a central role in psychiatric theory and practice. Narrative capacities, skills, practices, and specific content contribute to the causes and course of psychopathology as well as to processes of coping, resilience, healing and recovery. The paradigms of embodiment and enactment in cognitive science provide ways to approach the interactions between cultural discursive formations, narrative practices, and neurobiological mechanisms in psychiatry.
